To help make serving meals easier until mixture thickens and boils. Blend in salt and red pepper sauce. Taste for seasoning. Put about 1/2 of the sauce in the bottom of a quart, but they can all be cooked in one at one time, if you wish.

The preparation can be done the night before or in the morning, leaving the rest of the work to be done in the afternoon. If you prepare ahead, the meal should be stored in the refrigerator until the time it is to go into the oven.

When you are going to serve the pie, roll out the pie crust, cover with plastic wrap and place in refrigerator. Mix the pie filling, refrigerate, and put in pie crust just before baking.

Mr. Lewis to run for Lt. Governor

Mr. Lewis, 48, announced his candidacy for Lieutenant Governor in the May 1979, Kentucky Democratic Primary.

Mr. Lewis, 48, announced his plans today at a press conference in Louisville. He is the first candidate of any party to officially announce plans to seek the second highest office in the state in the 1979 elections.

Until recently a member of the Kentucky Workers' Compensation Board, Mr. Lewis, born in Hopkinsville and reared in Princeton, was elected three terms to the Kentucky House of Representatives from the 6th District, representing Caldwell, Crittenden, Lewis and Marshall Counties. In addition to serving as Representative, Mr. Lewis has served as a Director on the Purchase Area Crime Council and as a member of the Purchase Area Development Board.

Previously, he had served as assistant city planner with the Kentucky Department of Commerce, legal aide with the Kentucky Department of Labor, Executive Director of the Benton Municipal Housing Commission and Benton City Attorney.
