

NCHS baseball team trounces Fleming, 11-4

The Nicholas County High School baseball team ended their three game losing streak Monday afternoon with a win over the Fleming County Panthers with the final score: Nicholas County 11, Fleming County 4.

The Panthers failed to score in the first inning while the Bluejackets pulled ahead early, scoring five in the first inning.

During the second inning the Panthers hustled in four runs but then, thanks to the excellent pitching of Bobby Tinsler, a senior, who gave up only two hits, no runs and struck out 12 during the game, the Fleming County Panthers failed to score again.

The Bluejackets then scored three runs in the fourth inning and three in the sixth to secure a seven-point lead that won the ballgame.

The Bluejackets had 12 hits during the game and four errors while the Panthers had six hits with three errors. Two home runs were slammed across the field in Monday's game by Mike Hatton, a sophomore, and Jackie Wells also a sophomore.

Starting players for the Bluejackets are: Jeff Mattos, senior, second base (absent Monday); Bobby Tinsler, senior, started at first base then pitched; Tim Moreland, junior, starting pitcher; Mike Hatton, sophomore, shortstop; Todd Scott, senior, third base; Mark Mattos, senior, catcher; Rudy Randolph, junior, left field; Billy Munson, junior, centerfield; Jackie Wells, sophomore, right field; Mike Mattos, sophomore, pitcher.

Coach Billy K. Anderson commented that had weather which cancelled practices were not a factor for the Bluejackets past losses and that they (the team) were just beginning to get the kinks out and were looking forward to a good season.

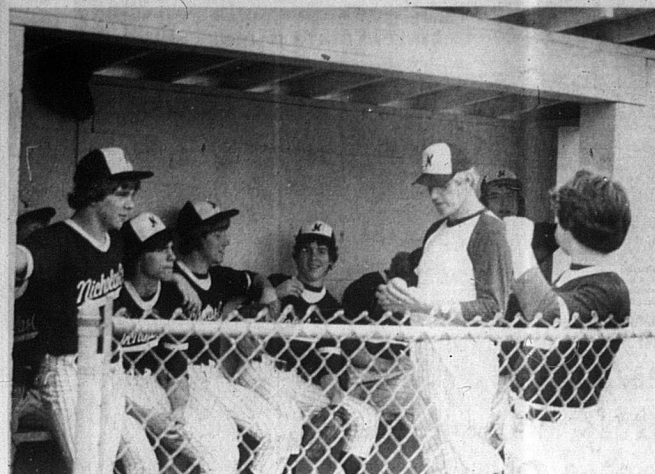

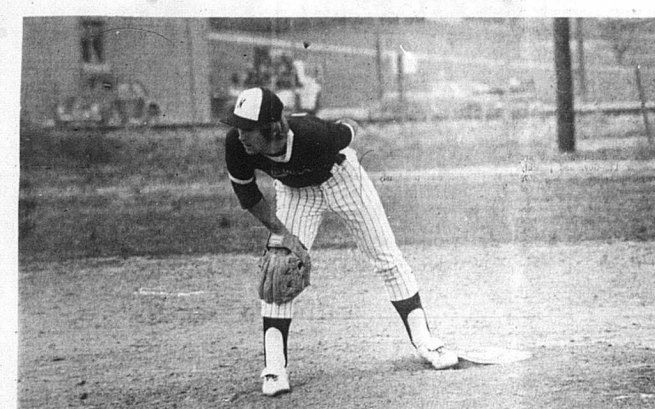

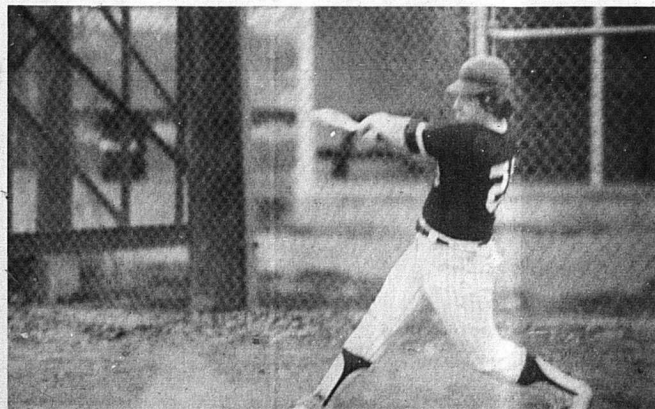
Dugout pow-wow

Democratic voters poll announced

A super-poll to gauge democratic voters preferences for candidates for Governor was announced today by its director, George Herman Kendall of Lexington. Simultaneous ads will appear in Kentucky dailies on Monday, April 3, with mail-in ballots to be used by registered voters to indicate their choices. "As far as I know," Mr. Kendall said, "this is the first such attempt to measure candidates' popularity across the State."

Also, he said that future polls are planned for Lt. Gov. and possibly Attorney-Gen. before the May 1979 primary, as well as a survey of important issues that may develop.

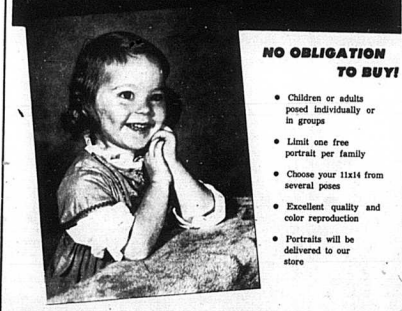
Voters may write-in their preferences or choose from a list of publicized candidates, including George Atkins, Tom Harris, Carroll Hubbard, Terry McTrayer, Harvey Sloan, Thelma

Stovall and any others that enter the race for Governor.

Mr. Kendall has previously conducted such polls as to the presidential race, collective bargaining and the Lexington Mayor's race. The published ballot requests the voter to list county in which registered as well as whether a student, senior citizen, public official, party worker or State employee. Mr. Kendall promised that every effort will be made to make the poll accurate, and invited comments and suggestions as to making it more effective. A CPA has been asked to audit the tabulations and ballots will not be opened until a press conference on April 11, City Hall, Lexington. Media and candidates' representatives are invited to be present.

"Every Kentuckian and especially elected officials will have a vital concern with the outcome of these peoples' polls," stated Mr. Kendall, "and we will continue them every other month until the election. We will see how campaigning and issues influence the voters as the campaign progresses."
