One of the most difficult tasks a newspaper ever faces is saying "No" to a group or individual wanting to promote a good cause. Such a thing happened in Carlisle recently...

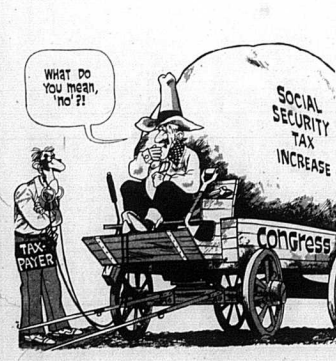
Optimist Club seeks donations, it's your chance to help with a new hospital chapel
