

# Boys win, girls lose track opener April 4

The Nicholas County Boys' Track Team won their opening game of the regular season Tuesday, April 4, by defeating Harrison and Clark Counties. The Girls' Track Team lost to Harrison and Clark also on Tuesday.

**Boys' track team**  
The final scores in the boys division were: Nicholas, 90%, Harrison, 60%, and Clark, 10%.

The best performances delivered were by Ron Hoser, junior, who placed first in four events, including hurdles, pole vault and mile relay; Dewain Williams, junior, first in long jump and triple jump; Mike Berry, junior, first in 440 yard relay; and a coupled first for Kevin Gillison, junior, first in shot put and discus throw; and Randy Hutter, junior, first in shot put and discus throw.

**Girls' track team**  
The final scores in the girls meet were Harrison 73, Clark 53, and Nicholas 25.

These were two first placers from Nicholas County, Tami Young, seventh grade, who won the long jump by jumping 14 feet 6 inches and Clarissa Williams, sophomore, who placed first in discus throw.

# Boys defeat Mason in Thursday meet

The Nicholas County Track Team matched up with Mason County, Thursday and the Bluejacket boys defeated the Royals 81% to 42. The girls, however, lost 45 to 64.

**Boys' track team**  
The boys, practically doubled their win over Mason with Dewain Williams, junior, winning in his three perfected specials including high jump, long jump and triple jump, and Ron Hoser, junior, once again at his best in hurdles, pole vault and mile relay. Kevin Gillison, junior and Randy Hutter, junior, placed first in discus throw. Mike Willis, junior, placed first in the 100 yard dash and Mike Berry, junior, won in the 440 yard relay. Gary Halloran, junior, was a new winner in Thursday's game, he won the two-mile run.

**Girls' track team**  
Even though the girls lost this meet, they worked hard and some did exceptionally well.

The relay team including Tami Young, seventh grade, Bridgett Young, eighth grade, and Stephanie Young, placed first. Bridgett Young also took a number one mark in the 225 yard dash. Clarissa Williams, sophomore, placed first in discus throw and Deanna Darrell, sophomore, placed first in discus throw.

The Bluejackets failed to score in the top of the seventh and the game went to Bourbon County.

Bourbon County had five runs on six hits with no errors and Nicholas secured six runs on six hits with three errors.

**Budget Amendment**  
The Nicholas County Budget Commission hereby proposes an Amendment to the Nicholas County Budget for the Fiscal year commencing July 1, 1977 and ending June 30, 1978 as follows:  
Monies in the amount of \$1222.31 received from the Governor's Contingency Fund and monies in the amount of \$464.90 received from the Department of Transportation for snow removal and other inclement-weather related operations shall be deposited to the Road and Bridge Fund totaling a sum of \$169,902.21.  
Funds of \$428.21 shall be transferred to Labor Code 110-A-5  
Funds of \$123.53 shall be transferred to Road and Bridge Maintenance Operating Supplies Code 110-B-2B  
Funds of \$124.57 shall be transferred to Miscellaneous Code 150-C-3C

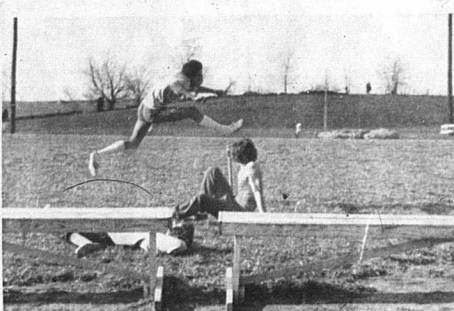
