WILLIAM D. ISON

William Davis Ison, 46, of Ison, Ky., was among the five men killed April 4 in Buco, Va., apparently from lack of oxygen in a mine shaft, officials of the Cliftonfield Coal Co. said.
 Mr. Ison was a brother of Mrs. G. C. Terrell of Carleisle.

A spokesman for the Connecticut-based Pitcon Coal Group, which owns Cliftonfield, said six miners were working in a new mine shaft deep inside a mountain in Dickenson County — which borders Pike County, Ky. — when one of the miners bored into an abandoned mine that held "black dump" air that contained no oxygen.
 The spokesman said three men escaped to the surface and alerted Mr. Ison, an official of the federal Mine Safety and Health Administration, and a mine service company employee, who rushed to the site.
 Both would-be rescuers also succumbed in the shaft, he said.

Fiscal Court names free dumping day

Fiscal Court designated April 30 as a free dumping day at the Nicholas County landfill at its regular meeting, held Wednesday, April 4.
 The Fiscal Court also appointed Dr. Robert B. Sparks to fill the vacancy on the Johnson-Mathers Health Care Inc. Board. He will fill out the term of the late Ralph Shearer whose term will expire January 1981.
 Openings on bids for insurance on the old Carleisle Army were discussed and it was decided to extend the opening until April 19.
 The Nicholas County Budget Commission proposed an amendment to the Nicholas County Budget to deposit all money received from the Governor's Contingency Fund and the Department of Transportation for the inclement weather. The proposal and a copy of the Budget Amendment is to be sent to the State Local Finance officer for approval.
 The board also approved a contract with the Bureau of Highways who

under the terms of the agreement, will furnish materials, equipment, and equipment operators to aid in proceeding known as Blountstown Maintenance. Maintenance operations to be fulfilled under this contract are: surfacing, repaving shoulders, general roadwidening, mowing (wheel view is obstructed), roadway drainage and extraordinary, such as relief.
 Fiscal Court agreed to pay the Nicholas County Board of Assessment Appeals \$25 per day during 1973. There are three seats on this board, two of which are vacant at the present time and one held by Ota Caswell.
 The Fiscal Court also approved the contract between itself and the Bureau of Highways, thereby accepting all roads and streets listed in the contract as being part of the County Road System.
 Also approved by court was the naming of Magistrate Lovell Livingston and Paul Tinch to the Carleisle Cemetery Committee.

Council changes Dorseyville speed

Several concerned citizens from Dorseyville were present at the City Council meeting Monday night. They came to discuss the traffic situation in Dorseyville. They stated that most cars had to park on one side of the road, many times blocking drives and resulting in a one-lane road through Dorseyville. The group also complained that many motorists all but ignore the 20 m.p.h. speed limit, making the area particularly dangerous for children.
 The Council discussed the problem at length and it was decided to enforce a 25 m.p.h. speed limit throughout Dorseyville and to research the idea of constructing alleys between the houses and the creek for additional parking.
 Mrs. Carolyn Dalton presented the slide presentation that was used in the All-Kentucky City contest and was presented with an award by Mayor Power from the City of Carleisle for her outstanding community efforts. The plaque was inscribed with Mrs. Dalton's name.
 Les Costley discussed again with the City Council his plans for building a Pic Pac Supermarket on West Highway #36 and his need for an annexation so gas and water can be made available to the area.

The fire committee agreed Monday to meet with the fire department on April 18 to discuss and resolve problems in the Fire Department.
 A revised contract on the Upper Jacktowns bridge construction was passed 5-4 at a called meeting April 5. Councilman Clarence Cord was absent.
 Ashby McHaffey was appointed to the Henryville Committee. Earl Hunt was hired to man the Police Radio at \$2.65 per hour.
