It's forest fire danger season, law is in effect

Kentucky Division of Forestry has issued a reminder that the forest fire danger season is here and urges everyone to be extremely careful with outdoor burning.

The forest fire law (KRS 149.000) is in effect from March 1 to May 15 and Oct. 1 to Dec. 15 each year and prohibits debris burning within 150 feet of woodlands except between the hours of 6:30 p.m. and midnight.

Kentucky's forest fire laws are made for the protection of our woodlands. One of the most important laws is KRS 149.000, Setting Fires on Open Land.

Regulated, which states, "It shall be unlawful, within or adjacent to timberland, for any person to set fire to or procure another to set fire to, any flammable material upon land owned or leased by him unless he previously shall have taken all reasonable care and precaution, by having the flammable material cut and piled or carefully cleared around the same, to prevent the spread of such fires to the land other than those owned or leased by him. It shall also be unlawful for any employee of any such owner or lessee of

land to set fire to any flammable material, upon such land unless he shall have taken similar precautions to prevent the spread of such fire to any other land."

Violators of the forest fire laws, when convicted, are subject to both fine and imprisonment. They are also responsible for the cost of suppression of the fire. To report a forest fire, call John Morland, Nicholas County Guard, at 68-4106, or the District Office at Morehead, phone 784-7504.

Division of Forestry employees patrol the woodlands throughout the state to apprehend forest fire law violators. They urge everyone to be extremely careful with outdoor fires.
