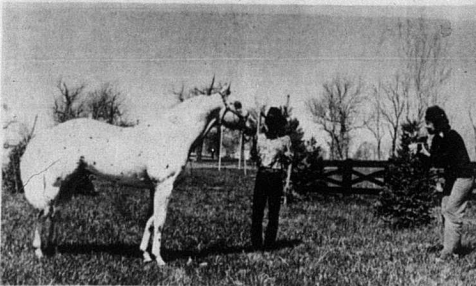

Six new geologic maps covering portions of Eastern and Central Kentucky have just been published, announced Dr. Wallace W. Hagan, state geologist and director of the Kentucky Geological Survey at the University of Kentucky.

The maps are of the:

- Ballardville quadrangle, covering parts of Trimble and Oldham Counties;
- Bethlehem quadrangle, covering part of Henry County;
- Orrville quadrangle, covering parts of Bath and Menifee Counties;
- Sharpsburg quadrangle, covering parts of Bath, Bourbon, Montgomery,

Ky. Heifer sale youth's opportunity

Kentucky youngsters who wish to start into the dairy cattle business or even add to their present herd will have the opportunity to bid on some high quality animals April 29 at the Sixth Annual All Breeds Dairy Heifer Sale to be conducted at the Western Kentucky University Farm, Bowling Green.

The objective of the sale, which is sponsored by the Kentucky Pared Dairy Cattle Association in cooperation with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture, is to allow young people the chance to purchase top registered animals for use in a 4-H or FFA Dairy Project. This year, approximately 300 heifers are to be offered for sale.

A new segment of the sale this year will be the "Production Award" part. All heifers of all breeds born July 1 through Dec. 31, 1977, will be in this part of the sale. Twenty per cent of the gross sale of the "Production Award" animals will be set aside for an award distributed on the following basis:

- 1st Place - 25%; 2nd Place - 20%; 3rd Place - 15%; 4th Place - 10%; 5th Place - 10%; 6th Place - 10%; 7th Place - 5%; and 8th Place - 5%.

These awards will be based on the most 4% fat corrected milk from the heifers first 305 day lactation, provided they calves before reaching 28 months of age. Records must be made on DHER or regularly organized DHI. There will also be Junior Calves, Junior Yearlings offered for sale which will not be a part of the "Production Award".

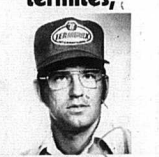
Night class registration
