Export sales help state

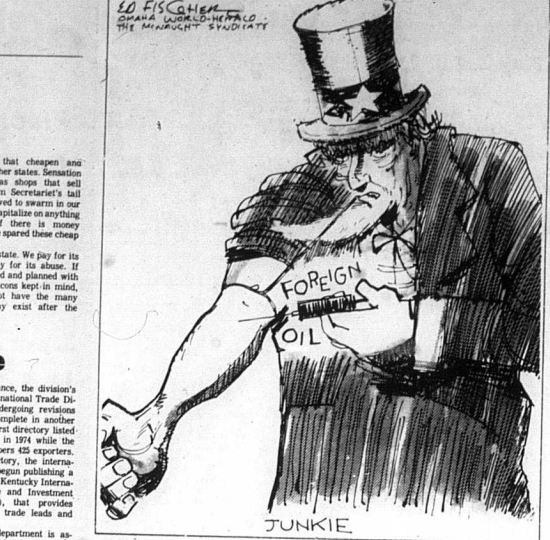

Berea offers family folk week June 18

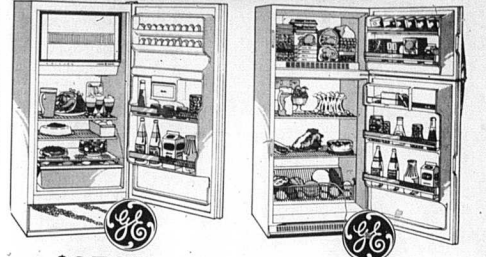
BEREA — A Midsummer Family Folk Week and leadership workshop will be offered by Berea College June 18-25.

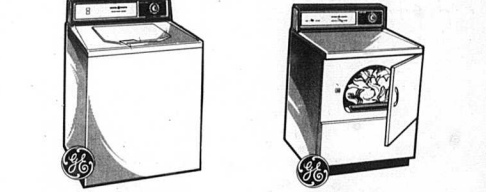
