

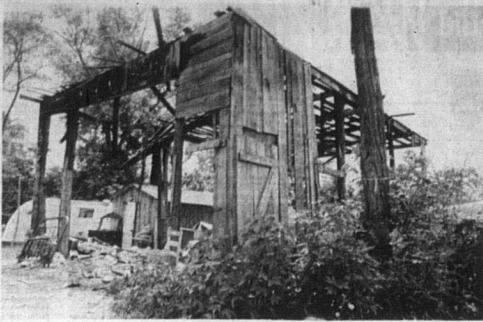
Obituaries

The Aug. 1 retirement of Kentucky State Police Field Operations Commander Leslie C. Pyles has been announced at Frankfort by KSP Commissioner Ken Brandenburg. Thirteen nations will compete for world title

Thirteen nations have sent official word that they will compete in the 1978 World Three-Day Championships to be held at the Kentucky Horse Park, Lexington, Sept. 14-17.

The championships are an Olympic-level contest for equestrians. Nations and numbers of competitors are:

- Argentina, a team of four plus one individual competitor;
- Australia, a team of four;
- Brazil, one individual competitor;
- Canada, a team of four plus two individual competitors;
- France, a team of four plus two individual competitors;
- West Germany, a team of four plus two individual competitors;

Total riders represented stand at 65. There will be ten teams comprising 39 riders, and 26 individual riders.

Gold, silver and bronze medals are awarded to both teams and individuals. The country of the individual gold medal winner gains the right to host the 1982 world three-day championship.

Burley price supports to be increased in '78

Price supports for the new 1978 burley tobacco crop have been increased 6.3 per cent over 1977, the U. S. Department of Agriculture announced this week.

Support level for 1978 will average \$18.5 per hundredweight, up 6.4 over last year, said the USDA in an announcement to the Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association, which administers the price support program in Kentucky, Indiana, Ohio, West Virginia and Missouri.

The increase is authorized by law in conformity with the parity index on farm prices. Wage rates have jumped more than 11 per cent, including the January 1978 boom in the Federal minimum to \$2.65 per hour, up from \$2.30. Price rises also are taken into account for tractor fuel, repairs and chemicals.

Stewart Smith, acting administrator of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, noted that as in the past the Price supports will be available to eligible producers through grower associations such as the Burley Coop, under contracts with the Commodity Credit Corporation.

The rule on restricted pesticides is continued in effect, and growers must certify that they have not used DDT, DDE, toxaphene and endrin on their tobacco. Also, producers must certify their planted acreage.

The Burley Association and the Burley Stabilization Association, the latter operating for Tennessee, Virginia

and North Carolina growers, are authorized to withhold one cent per pound from the advance to producers, to help defray administration costs.

Alvin R. Beckley, executive secretary-treasurer of the Lexington-based Burley Coop, announced the recent sale of 2,068 hogheads of old crop burley, totaling 2,300,000 pounds. The transaction completed 25 hogheads from the 1978 crop and 2,059 hogheads from the 1977 crop.
