This week will be cookie recipes.

CHOCOLATE COCONUT BALLS
1 cup butter
2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup unsifted flour
1 cup grated coconut
2 ounces sweet cooking chocolate, broken up, chopped

CRISP COOKIES
Let one half pound of butter soften to room temperature so that it can be put in the mixer with one cup granulated sugar. When creamed, add two eggs yolk and mix thoroughly. Add one teaspoon vanilla and two cups regular flour. Refrigerate one hour.

FRUIT BARS
1/4 cup soft butter
1/2 cup raisins
1/2 cup apricots
1/2 cup cranberries
1/2 cup blueberries
1/2 cup orange marmalade
1/2 cup white sugar
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup flour
1/2 cup rolled oats
1/2 cup chopped nuts

QUICK COOKIES
2 cups brown sugar
2 eggs
1 cup pecans
2 cups flour
1 cup rolled butter
Mix and pour into pan. Cook 20 minutes in 350 degree oven. Cut and dip in confectioners' sugar.

FIESTA COOKIES
1 cup butter
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1/4 cup sifted flour
1/2 cup baking powder
1/2 teaspoon almond extract

Creem butter, sugar, almond extract and vanilla. Add eggs and beat well. Blend in vinegar and dry ingredients. Spread 1/2 of dough on greased, floured pan. Combine nuts and jam and spread over dough. Put rest of dough on top and bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until done. Cut into squares. Cool and roll in powdered sugar.

ANGEL COOKIES

3 egg whites
1 1/4 cups brown sugar
1 tablespoon flour
2 cups broken pecans
Beat egg whites until stiff. Gradually add sugar while beating. Fold in flour that has been tossed in the flour. Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 275 degrees for 1 hour and 25 degrees for 30 minutes more.

Patt, Barnes attend SS meet

James Platt of Carlisle represented Southern States Cooperative's members at the association's 19th Annual Stockholders' meeting held in Richmond, Va., Nov. 13 and 14. Also attending the session was a Bruce Barnes representative of Carlisle Cooperative, the local Southern States retail outlet.

James also reported that the merger of Southern States Grain Marketing Cooperative, Inc. into Southern States Cooperative had been completed. Volume handled was 10,700,000 bushels with a dollar value of \$96,100,000. Net savings totaled \$14,000, enabling the payment of a 3 cent per bushel refund.

Armstrong pointed out that the dollar volume represented former member purchases of supplies and services, was the largest in history. He told delegates the cooperative's net worth totaled \$27,000,000, an increase of \$7,500,000 over the previous year. Working capital dollars - the excess of current assets over current liabilities - totaled \$37,500,000, an increase of \$5,500,000 over the previous year.
