Kay's Kitchen

Candy, this week for giving or to have on hand for those with a sweet tooth. Some you cook, some you don't.

PEANUT BUTTER BON BONS
1 cup butter or margarine
1 cup peanut butter
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1/2 cup crisp rice cereal
1/2 cup semi-sweet chocolate
Cream butter and sugar in peanut butter. Gradually add sugar and beat until smooth. Stir in rice cereal. Press into an ungreased cookie baking pan. Chill. Turn out onto board and cut into 100 squares. Keep cold. Store while break chocolate into small pieces; place in heavy pan. Melt over low heat or over water. Remove from heat and turn into bowl. Cool chocolate to 91 degrees (use fever or sweat thermometer to check temperature). Dip peanut butter into chocolate; place on wax paper to set. Store in refrigerator. If dipping is not your thing, spread chocolate over squares.

QUICK FUDGE
1 1/2-cup can sweetened condensed milk
2 6-ounce packages semi-sweet chocolate, melted
3 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted
1 cup chopped pecans
Add milk to melted chocolate; beat until smooth and thickened. Stir in pecans. Pour into 8 x 8 x 3 inch buttered pan. When firm cut into squares. 1 to 2 squares add a dash of salt to this when beating milk and chocolate.

WALNUT CARAMELS
1 cup butter or margarine
1 pound brown sugar
Dash of salt
1/2 cup evaporated milk
1 tablespoon butter
3 cups broken pecans
1/2 cup evaporated milk
Butter sides of heavy 2 quart saucepan. In melt butter or margarine; add brown sugar and salt; stir till thoroughly combined. Stir in light corn syrup; mix well. Gradually add cream, stirring constantly. Cook and stir over medium heat till candy reaches firm-salt stage (160 degrees) about 30 to 35 minutes. Remove from heat. Place nuts in bottom of buttered 9 x 9 x 2 inch cookie tin. Pour syrup over nuts. Cool; cut in squares.

CHEAM PRALINES
1/2 pound light brown sugar
Dash of salt
1/2 cup evaporated milk
1 tablespoon butter
3 cups broken pecans
1/2 cup evaporated milk
Butter sides of heavy 2 quart saucepan. In melt butter or margarine; add brown sugar and salt; stir till thoroughly combined. Stir in light corn syrup; mix well.
