FRANKFORT — For decades small trees producing purple blooms have flourished in riverbanks in Western Kentucky. While enhancing the pastoral appearance of the area's gently sloping hills, the trees were considered "waste" wood, having no apparent commercial value.

LEMON BREAD
1 cup margarine
1/2 cup sugar
3 eggs
2 1/2 cups flour
1/2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup buttermilk
Grated rind of 1 lemon
2 cups raisins, optional
1 cup buttermilk
1/2 cup molasses
Juice of two lemons
1/2 cup sugar

WHOLE WHEAT NUT BREAD
1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar
2 cups whole wheat flour
2 cups chopped nuts
1 cup chopped raisins, optional
1/2 cup molasses
Mix and sift all-purpose flour, baking powder, salt and sugar; stir in whole wheat flour, nuts and raisins. Combine buttermilk and molasses; add to flour mixture, stirring only until well mixed. Turn into greased loaf pan and bake 300 degrees for about 1 hour.

FRUIT BREAD
1 1/2 ounce pkg. cream cheese, softened
1 cup margarine
1/2 cup sugar
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
4 eggs
2 1/2 cups flour
1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 1/2 ounce can fruit cocktail, well drained
1/2 cup chopped nuts, optional
Blend cream cheese, margarine, sugar and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition, gradually add flour and baking powder. Fold in fruit and nuts. Divide batter between two well greased 9 x 5 x 3 inch loaf pans. Bake 325 degrees for 1 hour until cake tester comes out clean. Cool in pan about 5 minutes or more, remove from pans and cool thoroughly. This bread is the texture of a pound cake, and almost no sugar, bread, and rice to serve with a meal.
