## Minor accident causes traffic tie-up Monday

A vehicle operated by Mrs. Charles Watkins of Myers Road slid off the road Monday morning and into an embankment at the top of the hill on route 26 just this side of the traffic islands at the intersection of US 60 and 56. Traffic was held up over an hour according to Nicholas County Sheriff J. W. Ecton, who said the roads were extremely slick from a freezing rain. Fred Burnaw's wrecker slid off the pavement while he was attempting to pull the Watkins auto back onto the road.

The line of traffic, which was backed up due to the accident, then had to attempt the next hill one at a time, slipping and sliding all the way. While the Sheriff and Burnaw were attempting to clear the road of this traffic jam they looked down the hill to see another vehicle off the road on US68. This unidentified vehicle had

made a left turn (toward Mayville) at the traffic islands and somehow came to a stop in the ditch of the exit lane on the left side of the highway.

No injuries were reported in either accident.

Nicholas County Deputy Sheriff Ralph Brookshire said he investigated a non-injury accident at about 2:30 p.m. Monday on the Scrub Grass Road. According to the accident report vehicle operated by William C. Minton of Scrub Grass Road and Gregory Todd Rawlings of 509 Main St. ran together when neither driver was able to stop due to the icy road conditions.

Nicholas County Deputy Sheriff Ralph Brookshire investigated a non-injury accident about 8:45 a.m. Monday, Feb. 13 about four miles Southeast of Carlisle on the East Union Road. Vehicles involved in the accident were operated by Vicki K. Ring and Allie Coleman both of Route 2. A pickup truck operated by Paul Day of Route 3 collided about 5 p.m. Feb. 7 with a car operated by David Lee Whitaker of Lexington. The mishap occurred on the Saltwell Road at a spot where the snow had been partially cleared, but not enough for two vehicles to pass, the deputy sheriff said. He also stated it was the same spot where another accident had occurred which was reported in The Mercury last week. No injuries were reported.

the ASCS Office after Feb. 15. All carryover tobacco will be reported to the ASCS office by the warehouse where the carryover tobacco is stored. It will not be necessary for farmers to report their carryover to the ASCS office. All producers are required to return their marketing cards to the ASCS office as soon as they have completed their sales of tobacco.

A reduction in quota will be effective for 1978. Each farm quota will be reduced approximately 3.6%. Burley tobacco notices for 1978 will be mailed March 15. Producers will not be mailed a tobacco notice if they have not returned their marketing card by that date. Any carryover tobacco will not be shown on the notice, but will be deducted from the marketing card to be issued in October for the 1978 Marketing season.

## Legal services grant awarded

Nicholas County is among the four Northeastern Kentucky counties along with Boyd County to have the benefit of added legal services as a result of a \$54,614 grant by the Legal Services Corp., Senators Wendell Ford and Walker. The Huddleston announced Tuesday.

Northeast Kentucky Legal Services will provide the funds to expand their existing offices, thereby enabling the program to provide additional services to Nicholas, Robertson, Bracken and Mason counties.

The funds will set up an office in Ashland transferring Boyd County from the Northern Kentucky area.
