Earth Watch scholarship program

FRANKFORT—Students who wish to participate in the Earthwatch Scholarship Program must apply this year through the national office. In past years students have applied through the state Department of Education.

Earthwatch, established in 1973, recognizes excellence, leadership and creative development among young people from 16 to 21 years of age who want to devote their careers to research, exploration and public service. Scholarship winners join scientific expeditions during the summer and work side-by-side with biologists, geologists, anthropologists and marine scientists conducting research in the United States and abroad.

Full and partial scholarships are awarded to students demonstrating academic aptitude, physical stamina, agile imagination and a capability for research and discovery. Last year three Kentucky young people were among 18 students who were awarded Earthwatch scholarships. In 1978 national winners included four Kentuckians.

The six-year-old Earthwatch Scholarship Program is funded entirely from private sources. A non-profit organi-
