— Most pharmacies will provide a drugstore service if you ask for it. They list all the drugs you are taking and figure out which drugs may have harmful interactions.

— If you ask, a pharmacist will also tell you which medicines you are taking will interact unfavorably with other substances, such as aspirin or alcohol.

— For tax purposes, you can also have your pharmacist keep a list of all the drugs you have bought during the year. Money spent on drugs is often tax-deductible.

— If the instructions on the bottle labels don't make the pharmacist to explain them.
