

## Bureau for Social Services names new district manager

FRANKFORT — Ben J. McClellan has been appointed district program manager in 16 Bluegrass counties for the Bureau for Social Services, Department for Human Resources, effective July 1.

McClellan will be in charge of various activities in Nicholas, Anderson, Bourbon, Boyle, Clark, Estill, Franklin, Garrard, Harrison, Jessamine, Lincoln, Madison, Mercer, Powell, Scott and Woodford counties.

For the past three years, McClellan has been administrative assistant to Social Services Commissioner Jack C. Lewis. McClellan grew up in Richmond, Ky., and graduated from Madison Central High School there. He has a bachelor of science degree from Eastern Kentucky University and a master of science in social work degree from the Kent School of Social Work, University of Louisville.

McClellan joined state government in 1964 as a social worker in Madison and Clark counties. After earning his master's degree, he became supervisor of the juvenile counseling unit in Louisville, and then a supervisor in Bullitt, Henry, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer and Trimble counties. He has also worked at a Youth Treatment Center, Louisville, and the Morehead Treatment Center in Morehead.

McClellan has also served as an administrator in the Lincoln Trail and Green River districts and a regional program manager in western Kentucky. He and his wife will continue to live in Frankfort.

## Dale Hollow Lake State Park officially opens July 26

FRANKFORT — For years Dale Hollow Lake, meandering along the border of Kentucky and Tennessee in the southeastern portion of the state, has been a mecca for the country's smallmouth bass fishermen. Fishing and boating enthusiasts have also flocked to the clear, emerald-green waters of Dale Hollow.

Some 12 farms were purchased for the Dale Hollow park, contributing to its 497 acreage. An additional 900 acres of land has been leased by the department for inclusion in the park.

Dale Hollow Lake State Park's farm heritage was enhanced and not obscured during the park's development. Many log buildings remain on the site, including a ranger information station that previously served as a corn crib. There are also evident throughout the park, perhaps accounting for the many deer that continue to roam Dale Hollow as their home.

A prime feature of the new park is its 77 by 210' boat ramp and fishing marina. A short-order restaurant with a seating capacity for 70 persons is located nearby.

Trooper Island, a summer camp for underprivileged boys operated by the Kentucky State Police, is located within sight of the marina. Yet another island nearby belongs to Tennessee.

Some 144 camping sites with complete electrical hook-ups are located within the park, along with three bathhouses and laundromats and a 30' by 60' swimming pool. A wedding pool for smaller children will soon be added.

Dale Hollow visitors also have access to "picnic road," lined with 26 picnic tables and several grills. A shelter may someday be constructed along the circular drive at the end of the road.

An unexpected, natural attraction at Dale Hollow may become a favorite visiting area for future guests — a one-fourth mile long cave near the main road. Known locally as "old Cindy's cave," it is named after a woman who lived nearby. While organized park tours at Dale Hollow may include stops at the cave's entrance, no one will as yet be permitted to tour the cave.

Parks Commissioner Montgomery emphasized that present plans for Dale Hollow do not include the building of a lodge, restaurant and cabins, thus making it a resort park. He explained that the nearness (about 30 miles) to Lake Cumberland State Resort Park, at Junctiontown, would make a Dale Hollow resort park unfeasible.

Although the park's opening ceremonies will not take place until July 26, Dale Hollow has been receiving guests since Memorial Day Weekend.

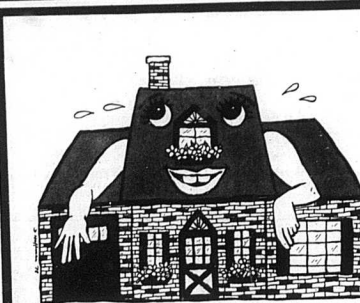
