### CBS to cover equestrian championships

Frankfort — The Commonwealth of Kentucky today signed a contract with CBS Sports for exclusive domestic television coverage of the 1978 World 3-Day Equestrian Championships which will be held at the new Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington from September 14 through September 17.

The event will be taped and the program broadcast on "CBS Sports Spectacular" on Saturday, September 30, from 4 to 5 p.m. William Slesakran, a former Olympian gold medal winner and noted equestrian authority, will provide commentary along with other CBS personalities.

Marvin H. Sugarman Productions, Inc. will produce both domestic and foreign television coverage and act as the agent of the Commonwealth for the licensing of foreign rights. Sugarman, a regular producer for "CBS Sports Spectacular", is one of the most successful independent producers and packagers of sports events for television, including horse racing, hockey, basketball and soccer.

Because of the acute interest in equestrian competition abroad, it is expected that several countries will carry live coverage of the event via satellite, and as many as 20 countries will broadcast some coverage.

## Possible escapees involved in chase

Two men who escaped from the Nicholas County Jail March 2 may have been involved in a high-speed chase in Bourbon County May 23.

Kentucky State Trooper Russ Sparks said the two men he pursued on U. S. 27 north of Paris last Thursday may have been Edward White and Clarence Tester, who have been at large since overpowering Nicholas County Jailer Lynn Bowles and his wife in March. White, 28, Morgan County and Tester, 28, Sharpshurg, locked Mrs. Bowles in the jail and kidnaped Bowles March 2. The two took Bowles and his car to Morgan County and robbed him of \$60 before releasing him unharmed. They have been at large since while being sought on numerous charges of forgery, burglary, theft, escaping and kidnapping.

Trooper Sparks said he began chasing a four-wheel drive vehicle on U. S. 27 last Thursday for speeding when he left the road and turned onto Runnymede Farm. The two men escaped through at least 12 fences before wrecking the truck and crashing on foot.

Other area law enforcement units were called to assist Sparks, including a canine unit from the Lexington Metro Police Department. While the search

was on, it was discovered that the two unidentified men were also suspected of stealing a South Central Bell Telephone Co. truck in Paris early last Thursday.

The search efforts were unsuccessful but Sparks said later the two men resembled a description of White and Tester.

White and Tester were in Nicholas County Jail on burglary charges stemming from the theft of farm equipment from Martin George. They were also charged in Bourbon County with four counts of second degree forgery.

The two escaped in March when they pulled a gun, struggled into the jail by an unknown party, and forced Bowles to free them. The escape took place about 7 a.m. when Bowles was releasing the prisoners from the bullpen, where they were kept overnight, into the other area of the jail.

Nicholas County Sheriff J. W. Ecton reported that, "the pair was sent to Nicholas County from Bath County where they faced third degree burglary charges."

Sheriff Ecton also stated that the State Police were fairly sure that the two were the same ones who escaped from jail here. As of press time, White and Tester, 28, have not been apprehended.
