Elections Board to start purge of non-voters

Secretary of State David R. Davis announced today that the State Board of Elections, of which he is chairman, will soon conduct its first statewide purge of voters as required by Kentucky law. The name of any registered voter who has not voted at least once during the last four years will be deleted from the list.

Mr. Davis emphasized that the legislative intent of the purge is to delete the names of those who are dead, have moved or have been registered voters. The purpose of the purge is to remove ineligible voters from the voting rolls. This should minimize the possibility of voting irregularities.

If a registered voter receives a notice that his name has been purged and believes that he has, in fact, voted at least once since the November, 1972 election, he has 30 days to protest his purgation to his County Board of Elections. If, after examining voting records, the County Board finds that the voter has voted at least once, the County Board will reinstate the voter. If the protest is denied and the voter wishes to vote, he can re-register to vote independently and vote in the next election.

Older Worker Week

FRANKFORT — National Employment Older Worker Week is being observed March 12-14. Julia M. Hubert, the state's older worker representative in the Kentucky Department for Human Resources, says the media campaign in Kentucky and throughout the nation will emphasize that America is wasting another of its more important natural resources, the older worker.

Statistics show that many of the 14 million people 40 years of age or older in this country are out of work.

Gov. Roy's original proposal was to eliminate these units completely. I amended the original bill in committee to include the "Superintendent Unit" which will mean another \$19,000 in each local district. This unit was omitted in the original draft of this legislation.

I appeared before the House committee on education last Wednesday and succeeded in having them report out favorably my "Snow Bank" bill, SB 198. This bill has already passed the Senate and should be up for passage in the House this week. It will bring the options for local boards to make up days missed due to snow or other disasters.

The entire Senate passed a measure to prohibit schools from charging fees for instructional materials and to require each school to spend at least \$9 per child per year on "consumable instructional materials". The Senate also passed a bill requiring smoke detectors be installed in all new construction including private homes. There were ten votes against this measure, one being mine. I feel this is one again government infringement on individual rights. The vote was 26-10.

Another bill which will have an impact on the towns in our district has already passed the Senate and is posted for consideration in the House committee on Counties and Special Districts. The bill would include residential care among those areas required to include wheelchair ramps at crosswalks for those or reconstruction of curbs and gutters.

In the Senate Education committee this week we reported out SB 313 which is a bill sponsored by me to fund the four year phase out of the Special House units in our school districts. The

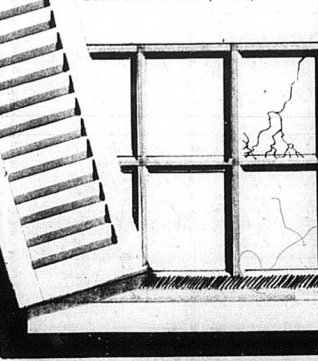
