PCA execs attend meeting in Gatlinburg

More than 47 officers, directors and their wives from Trade Area Credit Associations (PCAs) in Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio and Tennessee convened March 14-16 at the Sheraton Hotel, Gatlinburg, Tennessee, for the 1978 FICPA Presidents and Directors Conference.

According to J. B. Lutzford, president of the Eastern KY. Production Credit Association, those attending the conference from this area were Robert McGlothlin, Chairman of the Board of Directors; Charles Allison, Vice Chairman; Jack Brenneisel, James Finch and W. H. Greer, Board members, and T. W. Kline, vice president.

Hosted by the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Louisville (FICB), the conference included reports by bank officers regarding operations of Fourth District Production Credit Associations and the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Louisville.

The Eastern KY. Production Credit Association made about farm and intermediate-term loans to farmers in Eastern KY. counties, and presently has \$80,000,000 in loans outstanding to 1600 farmers. The Louisville FICB produces loan funds for use by Production Credit Associations in the four states which comprise the Fourth District.

Altogether, the 39 PCAs which serve full and part-time farmers and rural residents in the Fourth District currently have more than \$2.3 billion outstanding in loans to nearly 100,000 member-farmers.
