For one who must write a column each week, receiving a letter saying it is enjoyed, makes the next week easier to do. In my case, I have someone who enclose interesting recipes is doubly nice. On March 13, I received a very nice letter from James Crump of Ft. Collins, Colo. Mr. Crump always interest me. Here is his letter in part, and his recipes.

Some time back you ran a recipe for Burgo but it was for a large amount to be cooked outdoors. You mentioned that a person could figure it out so as to cook a smaller batch. In going through some of my old papers, I ran across a burgo recipe for making six quarts and I have enclosed same. Also enclosed is a recipe for corn cob jelly. This is an old recipe and believe it or not it makes real good jelly. The recipe for Roastbeef Cake is used by a lot of ranch cooks when they are cooking out on the range. I thought I would pass these on to you and maybe someone will use them in your column.

**KENTUCKY BURGO**  
2½ lb. beef chuck, cut to 1½-inch cubes  
1 frying chicken (about 3 lbs.), cut in advance of serving and refrigerated. (Remove fat from top before testing.)  
1½ teaspoons liquid red pepper  
3 teaspoons salt or to taste  
3 cups water

**ROASTBEEF CAKE**  
¼ cup of flour  
1½ cup sugar  
2 eggs  
cup cooking oil  
½ cup soda  
½ salt  
cup butter/milk  
cup dates  
cup vanilla  
½ cup vinegar  
cup nutmeg  
½ cup cinnamon

Mix above ingredients and bake for 45 minutes at 325 degrees. For icing, mix 1 cup of sugar, ¼ stick margarine, ½ tsp. soda, 2 tsp. syrup and ½ cup butter/milk. Boil 5 minutes or until mixture is thick enough. Pour over hot cake. Thank you so much Mr. Crump.
