ell on Higher Education said a good ballpark estimate would be somewhere between 20 and 25 per cent. The schools know how many students will drop through their job placement bureau, but Snyder said that many students get jobs on their own and no record is kept of these.

Supermarkets, restaurants and many service establishments provide part-time jobs for students, and most of them must pay the minimum federal wage.

The national student work survey showed that students should not work more than 20 hours per week if the student carries a full load of courses for a semester. Some work more, but their study load is reduced.

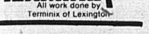
