This week I called on the girls in the office to give me ideas for a Mother's Day column. After eight years it is a bit difficult to come up with something different for all the special occasions during the year. We settled on a potluck dinner, either at mother's home or the home of one of the children, everybody bringing their "special". Of course being all in the family it would be best to have a menu to discuss your contribution so the menu will be varied.

One thing that was definitely settled was that I was to be in charge of the cooking, in spite of it being their day, the men could wash the dishes and tidy up after the meal. Daughters and daughters-in-law may be mothers too and deserve the treat.

The following recipes are suggestions in case you want to try something different.

VEGETABLE DELIGHT
2 16-ounce packages broccoli spears
2 sprouts cans whole tomatoes
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
4 teaspoons flour
2 teaspoons minced onion
1/2 cup cracker crumbs
1/2 teaspoon butter or margarine
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
Add salt and pepper to taste.
Cook broccoli, according to package directions, until almost done. Drain tomatoes, reserving liquid. Melt butter; stir in flour and onion. Slowly add reserved tomato liquid and cook, stirring constantly, until thickened. Drain broccoli and place in the center of a shallow casserole dish. Slice

tomatoes in half crosswise and place decoratively around broccoli. Spoon sauce over vegetables and top with cracker crumbs that have been sauteed in butter. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Makes 12 servings.

PINEAPPLE-ICEBOX CAKE
Combine 2 cups crushed pineapple, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/4 cup chopped pecans, 1/2 cup melted butter. Line bottom of Pyrex oblong dish about 5 in. x 4 in. with a layer of crushed vanilla wafers; then a layer of pineapple mixture and so on, ending with crumbs. Refrigerate overnight. To serve: cut into squares and top with whipped cream and a pecan half. This is good pineapple in every easy to prepare.

CUCUMBER-COLLAGE CHEESE-SALAD
Dissolve a package of large gelatin in one- and one-fourth cups of water and add a sprinkling of salt and a tablespoon of vinegar. Peel a large cucumber, chop it up and put in a colander to drain. Drain thoroughly. Mix in a small amount of onion, a portion of cottage cheese, drained well, one-half cup of mayonnaise and 1/2 cup of chopped nuts. Put in a greased quart-size mold.
Turn out on platter to serve. Garnish with Bibb lettuce, cocktail tomatoes, or watercress.
The fancy mold or ring mold if you have it. If using ring mold, serve dressing in small bowl that will fit in center of mold. This will make a nice buffet dinner salad.
