Memorial Day Weekend - Hot dogs
 - Franks or what have you. Why do they seem to go together like "Ham and eggs"? Maybe it is because it is usually the first family outing. In this day of grills, the picnic will more than likely be in your own backyard, so go ahead and grill your frankfurters. Don't forget the beans, relishes, etc.
 I'll give you a good vegetable composed salad. You can make it the day before, most men like it and it makes enough to serve 15 or 20. So if friends come by don't worry you will have enough.

VEGETARIAN SALAD
 1 package Lemon-Jello, 1/4 cups boiling water. Add 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon red pepper, 1/2 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 cup vinegar and 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Stir until jello is dissolved. Prepare and add: 1 tablespoon grated onion, 1/2 cup chopped pimiento, 1/2 cup diced celery, 1 cup shredded lettuce, 1/2 cup grated carrot, 1 cup chopped peas. Pour into large oblong serving dish. The meal would not be complete without a good salad. Do you want the real thing try this recipe.

BAKED BEANS
 Soak 2 cups dried beans (Navy or Great Northern) overnight. Remember to have water level over the half way mark. Drain beans. Next morning bring to a boil and simmer slowly about

FRANK FRANKS
 This you play "by ear". Use needed amount of frank on a 1 inch piece. Make a marinade of 1/4 cup soy sauce, 1/4 cup catsup, 1/4 cup salad oil, 2 tablespoons vinegar, 1 teaspoon crushed mustard. This should be enough marinade if you are serving 15. Add frank, 16 small canned onions, use small round frank on onion, 16 pineapple chunks, 2 green peppers cut in 1 inch squares to marinate and chill about three hours.
 Cut 4 slices of bacon in half and partially cook. When ready to broil wrap bacon pieces around each pineapple chunk.
 On 9 or 10 inch skewers alternate the frank, vegetables and bacon wrapped pineapple. Cook about 15 minutes turning and brushing with marinade often.
 Let each person cook their own. Remember to put the onion on the skewer by sticking through the side. If you want the servings to be larger, you may add small canned whole potatoes and whole mushrooms. If you get carried away with this whole idea, maybe you had better double the marinade recipe.

BARBECUED FRANKS
 You may use your favorite barbecue sauce. Grill frank, brushing often with sauce. Serve on buns.
 For the children, please don't forget the marshmallows!

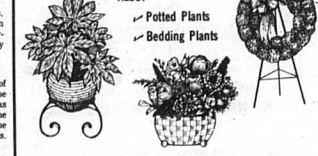
Style show

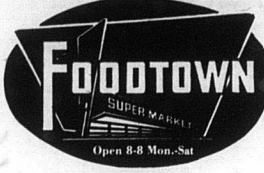

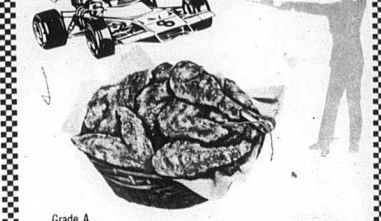
