One of the main things I wanted to see last week was that if you start looking for things you will need for holiday baking now, and buy one or two items each week, it will be easier on the food budget. Those extras can really do things to the weekly shopping budget.

Now with the cooler days it is easier for me to think of oven meals, and those foods we normally think of as fall fare. Recently I read an article on ways with baked potatoes. I put it aside until cooler weather. It was one of the recipes on to you. These baked potatoes are served with a topping and make a meal in one. Serve with your own topping: creamed tuna, hamburger in gravy, Sloppy Joe mix, etc. Bake the potato until done and large, split in half, if not crumbly top of potato and press down to open the potato and top putting over all.

**CREAMED HAM & MUSHROOM TOPPING**  
1/2 cup butter or margarine  
1/4 cup flour  
2 cups milk  
2 tablespoons prepared mustard  
2 cups cubed ham  
1/2 ounce can broiled mushrooms  
Salt butter. Blend in flour, mustard and slowly add milk. Stir until thick. Add ham and mushrooms. Serve over baked potato. Garnish with sprigs of parsley. This should make enough for six servings of one potato per person.

**CREAMED CHIPPED POTATO**  
1/2 lb. dried beef  
1 tablespoon butter or margarine  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
1/2 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce  
Dash of hot pepper sauce  
1 cup milk  
Salt and pepper as desired  
Shred dried beef into small pieces. Melt butter or margarine in frying pan. Fry onion and beef in pan. Sprinkle flour over.

Farmers may now pick up their marketing cards for the 1978 crop of barley at the Nicholas County ASCS Office Main Street Carlisle. Cards will not be mailed unless requested by producers unable to pick up their cards during regular office hours. Farm operators are reminded that if someone other than the farm operator is to pick up the card, the county ASCS office must have written authorization for another person to pick up the cards. Producers who have not returned the card certifying use or non-use of DDT, DDE, Toxaphene, or Endrin will need to do so before receiving their marketing card. If more than one marketing card is requested for a farm, producers should call the ASCS office prior to picking up the cards.

To add bacon, cook until crisp, break into bits, spread over half the potatoes as per onion.
