Time to think about the Thanksgiving dinner. This might be a good time to switch to something different from the traditional turkey and trimmings. The Department of Agriculture says there will not be enough turkeys to go around this year. This is in spite of the fact the department reported 80.7 million pounds of frozen turkeys being held in cold-storage warehouses as of Sept. 30. That is a lot of turkey, but the total is down 18 per cent from last year, and 21 per cent from 1974.

However, there is a plentiful supply of broiler chickens. So why not settle for that on your menu. You may stuff them with your favorite stuffing, and allow the savings per bird. A large platter filled with golden brown broilers would be just as exciting as one large turkey. And don't forget you will not have to worry about what to do with the leftover turkey.

You may want to use your favorite turkey dressing, but here are a few ideas to try. You want something different for your chickens.

WILD RICE AND BIRDMIP STUFFING
2 packages (8 ounces each) long grain and wild rice mixture. Bake 50 degrees for 30 minutes.

PUFFY BROCCOLI CAKE
1 egg white
1/2 cup mayonnaise
3 tablespoons Parmesan cheese
2 tablespoons parsley, chopped
2 tablespoons melted margarine
2 (10-ounce) cans frozen broccoli spears, cooked, drained. Keep hot.
