Sen. Walter "Dee" Huddleston out-  
 polled his Republican challenger, Louis  
 Guenther, Jr. 511 to 179 in Nicholas  
 County. A third candidate, the Ameri-  
 can Party pick Anthony A. McCord,  
 received 18 votes throughout the county  
 and was shut out in two precincts.  
 Guenther's highest count came in the  
 Mayors Office precinct where he tallied  
 38 votes to 102 for Huddleston.  
 U. S. Rep. Carl D. Perkins easily  
 outdistanced his Republican challeng-  
 er, Granville Thomas, here in the  
 county with 497 votes to Thomas's 136.
