Burley growers urged to fight 'subsidy' claims

Burley tobacco growers and their friends are being called upon to refute "subsidy" claims made against their crop.

Timed with the market opening, the Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association is urging its members and tobacco area leaders to "stress the importance of burley in the economy," and to "knock the bottom out of the mistakes claim that the tobacco program is a government subsidy."

A pamphlet titled "77 Crop Years" issued by the Burley Coop is being given wide distribution this week, through tobacco warehouses, county ASCS offices and others in the five-state area where the association handles the price-support program.

At Lexington, Ky., a visiting USDA official, John I. Morton, Washington, D. C., director of Producer Associations, urged directors and officers of the Burley Coop to "emphasize that the tobacco program is not a subsidized program."

"I'll tell you when you get a chance," he said. "It generates more than \$6 billion annually in taxes to state, federal and local."

Morton reported the Producer Associations office "have to answer letters all the time asking why the government subsidizes tobacco growing." Mostly they come from non-tobacco growing areas, New England, California and the West.

"People pick up a newspaper article and see where someone says the Federal government is subsidizing tobacco. They write and write, and we answer and answer. We spend a lot of time at it—sometimes up to 30 letters a day."

"True, the government lends money but the associations repay with interest," said Morton. "I notice that your pamphlet brings out that the Burley Association has repaid every cent it has borrowed, and also paid the government \$139.4 million in interest. It has handled 14 hundred million pounds of tobacco for farmers, and has paid them \$86 million. I wish to compliment you, and the way you are telling the story of price protection to the burley farmer, through 57 crop years."

Since 1933, Morton added, "our books at Washington show \$53.1 million written off for tobacco, mainly through the 1959 and 1966 crops of flue-cured tobacco, when in those years some varieties not desirable were taken under loan. Only \$53.1 million written-off in 45 years since the program started in 1933. It is a record no other commodity can claim. It represents around 12 one-hundredths of 1 per cent of the whole farm program."
