Panel appointed for Maxey Flats

A panel to study the long term care and maintenance of the Maxey Flats nuclear waste disposal site in Fleming County has been appointed by the Special Advisory Committee on Radioactive Waste Disposal. The Subcommittee on Cost and Financing will meet at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 24, in Room B of the Capitol Annex.

Members to serve on the panel are: Charles Brown, superintendent of the Fleming County Schools; chairman; Oscar H. Gerada, State Environmental Quality Commission; Jack Wilson, executive assistant to the state's Environmental Protection Commissioner; Charles Wickliffe, Executive Department for Finance; Russell McClure, special assistant to Gov. Julian Carroll; and as ex-officio members, Rep. Pete Worthington, D-Ewing and Sen. John "Eck" Rouse, D-Winchester, co-chairman of the Special Advisory

Committee on Radioactive Waste Disposal.

A second subcommittee on Site Status and Improvement will deal with short term problems in maintenance and care of the disposal site.

They will meet at 1:30 p.m., Wednesday, Oct. 25, in Room B of the Capitol Annex.

Members of the subcommittee are: Dr. Douglas Humphrey, professor of physics at Western Kentucky University; chairman; Irving Bell, Director of the Consumer Health Protection Division in the Kentucky Department for Human Resources; Dr. Margaret Hepler, professor of biological science at Morehead State University; Marjorie Denton, citizen participant; Dr. Hugh T. Spencer, associate professor of environmental engineering at the University of Louisville; and Representative Worthington and Senator Rouse.
