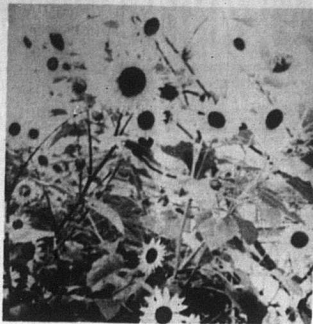

New loans available for silos

Nicholas County farmers can now obtain loans to build storage structures on their farms for silage, and also loans to remodel existing structures. The loans will benefit dairymen and livestock producers who need storage for silage, and also grain producers with storage structures that need remodeling.

These loans are available from the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) through County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Offices (ASCS).

In the past loans were available only for dry grain and high moisture grain. Eligible producers may borrow up to 85% of the cost of buying and installing storage facilities. The loan limit was increased last year from \$25,000 to \$40,000. The down payment required of farmers is 15% with an interest rate of 7% and a repayment period of eight years.

With the changes in the loan program, there has been an increase in loan activity around the state. At the present time, however, no loans have been made in Nicholas County. Additional information about the farm facility loan program may be obtained from the county ASCS office.
