Leases for the 1978 crop tobacco will be taken through Feb. 15, 1979. For those producers interested in leasing either to or from their farm, the ASCS office provides space on the bulletin board for entering the number of pounds for lease, the names and telephone numbers of person wanting to lease.

Producers are reminded that in order to transfer quota from one farm to another, a lease of the quota has to be made prior to marketing. All tobacco produced on a farm, must be sold on that farm's marketing card. Both the producers involved in the lease must come to the ASCS office to sign the lease agreement. However, it is not necessary for the producers to be present at the same time.
