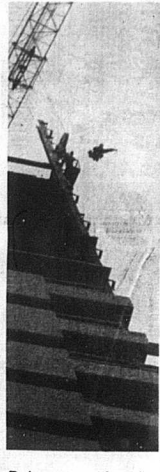

New plans bring optimism

FRANKFORT — Kentucky's top disaster response officials have expressed considerable optimism about the reorganization of all federal agencies dealing with disasters, following approval of the plan by the U. S. House of Representatives.

Senator Walter D. Henderson advanced representatives of the state Division of Disaster and Emergency Services that the House approved the plan by a 27-40 vote. He said that the Senate would approve the plan without a formal vote.

Maj. Gen. Billy G. Wellman, who heads the state emergency preparedness organization as Adjutant General, said that he is quite pleased with the action.

"We have been dealing with far too many federal agencies on a daily basis, and there has been considerable confusion during an actual disaster," General Wellman said. "I am confident that this reorganization will enable us to more effectively deal with the federal government to prepare for and respond to emergencies of all types."

Wilbur H. Buntin, Jr., DDES Executive Director, also expressed approval.

"We've made considerable progress in Kentucky within the last few years, and we are pleased to work with Senator Henderson to help develop the new federal program," Buntin said. "The new agency will give us considerably more flexibility so that we can utilize all of our resources to prepare for nuclear, natural, and manmade disasters."

The reorganization plan, which was proposed by President Carter during the summer, will consolidate several major federal agencies, including the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration, Defense Civil Preparedness Agency, and Federal Preparedness Agency. Additionally, several other functions, including the Emergency Broadcast System, the National Fire Prevention and Control Administration, and the Earthquake Hazard Reduction Program will be consolidated within the new Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Steps have already been undertaken to reorganize the federal program, but completion of the project is not expected until April 1, 1979.
