Kay's Kitchen

Here are the additional recipes for souredough bread. Then I made bread to some regular recipes that will be good for fall cooking.

- SOURDOUGH RECIPES:**
- 2 cups flour (You may use part whole wheat)
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 2 cups starter

Sift the dry ingredients into a bowl. Cut in the butter as regular biscuits. Turn the dough into a lightly floured breadboard and knead very lightly. Roll dough 1/4 inch thick and cut into small rounds. Place them on a buttered cookie sheet and bake 45 degrees for about 10 minutes. Watch these as they burn rather quickly.

SOURDOUGH FRUIT-AND-NUT BREAD
1 cup rolled oats
1/2 cup boiling water
2 tablespoons butter
2 cups starter
1 tablespoon salt
1/4 cup sugar
1 cup unbleached flour
1/2 cup whole-wheat flour
1 cup chopped nuts
1 1/2-cup whole wheat flour of your choice (mixed is fine), chopped
Four boiling water over oats; add water, stir and allow to sit 10 minutes. Meanwhile, mix starter, salt, honey, unbleached flour and one cup of whole-wheat flour together and knead well. Add oats, nuts and fruit and enough more whole-wheat flour to make a kneadable dough. Knead about 10 minutes or until dough is smooth and elastic. Roll in an oiled large bowl, turn dough all over with oil, cover tightly with plastic wrap and allow to rest, covered, for about 10 minutes. Divide into two portions, shape each into loaves and put in well-greased 8 1/2-by-4-inch loaf pans. Cover with wax paper and allow to rise at room temperature until doubled in bulk. Bake in a preheated, 375-degree oven for about 45 minutes or until done. This is excellent with all kinds of cheeses.

SOURDOUGH MUFFINS
1 cup starter
2 cups milk
1/2 cup butter
3/4 cup flour
2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon soda
1. Combine the starter, milk, cornmeal and 1/2 cup of flour. Stir to blend ingredients, cover and let the mixture stand overnight. When ready, stir mixture down and add the rest of the flour and all the other ingredients. Mix well, then turn out onto a floured
