It is all according to the way you want to look at it. The PSC does not have the authority to ban any kind of advertising. These rights are guaranteed by the U. S. Constitution. But if they can frigate it through regulations, it appears the PSC is going to do it. What we are talking about is an insignificant cost to consumers. Louisville Gas and Electric Co. even with a fairly extensive advertising budget, spend less than \$1 per year per customer for advertising last year. At a time when utilities' charges have skyrocketed, PSC is ragging on a great by trying to ban utility advertising instead of getting into the real meat of energy increases. Utility companies can justify their advertising costs just like any other business firm can. They need it. It is just that simple. And if the PSC cannot recognize this, it needs to upgrade its education in good business practices. —Buck County News-Outlook

April 7 is Cabin Fever Day in Paris

Auctioneer calls, bluegrass and country bands, children's shouts of joy and friends' laughter are the sounds to hear in Cabin Fever Festival Day in Paris, Ky., 18 miles north of Lexington on Highway US-27. Begun in 1978 as a community effort to rouse the populace from the lethargy and boredom of "cabin fever" after a long winter, the celebration will be repeated on April 7, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The Cabin Fever Festival celebrates the arrival of spring to the bluegrass. Its purpose is explained in a proclamation issued by county and city officials: "Whereas: The winter of 1979 has been extremely cold and too long in duration, and "Whereas: The phenomenon of "Cabin Fever" abounds, and "Whereas: Citizens of Bourbon County have suffered widely because of frozen pipes, leaking roofs and icy sidewalks, and "Whereas: Business, industry and agriculture have encountered numerous work shortages and income deficits and emotional shortcomings, and "Whereas: All citizens are in need of social outlets, and "Whereas: The First Annual Cabin Fever Festival was tremendously successful in the heralding of spring to central Kentucky. "RESOLVED: BE IT RESOLVED "I, April 7, 1979, is proclaimed as the Second Annual Cabin Fever Festival Day. "If The Courthouse Square is hereby designated as Cabin Fever termination point. "If The hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. are proclaimed hours. "If All citizens, relatives and friends are directed to the following events to be held on April 7, 1979: "A) Casual or "lacky" attire, sandy hats, "B) Bluegrass, country, rock, folk and other musical sounds will provide mood for street dancing. "C) Exhibitions of skills and crafts will be scheduled throughout the day. "D) There will be games and rides as well as booths for the sale of books. "E) Bargains in retail sale items will be provided by all merchants."
