

KET to film Fancy Farm candidates' gathering

For 40 members, Kentucky politicians have converged on the small town of Fancy Farm to signal the beginning of the fall election campaign. This year, KET will film the candidates and the crowd that comes to hear them on "Fancy Farm Highlights," airing Sunday, August 15 at 1 p.m. (ET).

The 90-minute program takes public television viewers on a lively personal tour of the non-partisan rally set amid the "country fair" atmosphere of the Fancy Farm grounds.

The whole community of 600 pitches in to help St. Jerome's Church host about 10,000 people from across the state who meet to consume six tons of delicious barbecue, shop the fair booths and listen to the "stump" speeches of the candidates.

Gov. Julian Carroll and gubernatorial candidates John Y. Brown, Jr. and Louie B. Nunn head the list of speakers. Speakers slated to climb aboard the flat-bed trucks to address the gathering in the yard of Fancy Farm school.

Visiting with the candidates and the crowd are KET's Mike Fazy, Charles Thompson and Larry Holden, the show's producer-director.

"It's going to be a fun television experience," beams Holden. "We plan about 10,000 people from across the state who meet to consume six tons of delicious barbecue, shop the fair booths and listen to the 'stump' speeches of the candidates."

Remarried widows of 60 or over can receive benefits

Ordinarily, a widow loses her Social Security rights when she remarries. But, benefits to a widow (or widower) who remarries at 60 or older can continue without any reduction in the amount. This law became effective 1-1-79.

If your new husband gets Social Security checks, however, you can take a wife's benefit on his record if it would be larger than your widow's payment.

Decreased gas rates approved

The Kentucky Energy Regulatory Commission has approved a decrease in rates for natural gas customers of Columbia Gas of Kentucky Inc. The decrease amounts to a little more than 6¢ cents per 1,000 cubic feet of gas. It is effective the date of approval, July 30.

The reduction is the result of a decrease in the cost of wholesale natural gas from the supplier, Columbia Gas Transmission Corp.

Japanese youth visits county

You may have an unusual opportunity for a bit of the Orient to touch your life this summer when a Japanese youth will be living with a 4-11 family in Nicholas County.

The youth from Japan arrived July 26, following a creation and welcoming program in Lexington, and will live here about a month, according to Mrs. Sharon A. Wilson, County Extension Agent for 4-11. Mrs. Wilson said that the Japanese visitor here will be part of a delegation of 71 youth and five adult leaders from Japan who are traveling to the Bluegrass State and visiting 26 counties in an international youth exchange program. The exchange is co-sponsored by the 4-11 program of the Cooperative Extension Service in Kentucky and the International Exchange Foundation in Japan.

While in the county, the Japanese youth will live with Mr. and Mrs. Paul Judge of Moorefield. Only families with 4-11 member or members were eligible to serve as volunteer host families.

This is the first year Nicholas County has participated in the international youth exchange program.

"The objective of the program is to experience a cultural exchange between the Japanese and us," said Mrs. Wilson. "For this reason, host families are being asked to live as normally as possible while entertaining their foreign guests to give the Japanese a fairly accurate view of how we live in Kentucky."

The Japanese youth will leave the country in August in time to make a flight back home to Japan, which is scheduled to leave the Lexington airport August 20.
