the next five academic years as part of MMI's 1980-85 fund raising program whose goal is to enhance school facilities, programs, and to build an endowment fund.

Mr. William H. Stamler, President of the W. R. Stamler Corporation of Millersburg and Chairman of the MMI Board of Trustees, obtained board approval to accept the gift and its matching fund provisions at the November 29 meeting of the board.

In November 1974 MMI launched a five-year fund raising campaign which resulted in alumni, parents, and friends of MMI donating more than \$25,000 to facility improvement, scholarship assistance and program enhancement. The goal of this new five-year program is to launch MMI into the eighties as \$50,000 with an annual target of \$100,000 per year.

Although the identity of the donor cannot be disclosed, his explanation for making the gift was his great satisfaction with the school's long standing educational contribution and importance to Bourbon County and the Bluegrass region of Kentucky. The 67-year old military school is one of Kentucky's few remaining boarding, nonsecter private schools.
