The reduction, effective Jan. 1, will amount to 1.6 cents per 1,000 cubic feet of gas.

The decrease is the result of a reduction in the cost of wholesale natural gas.

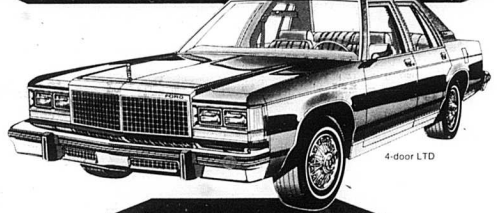

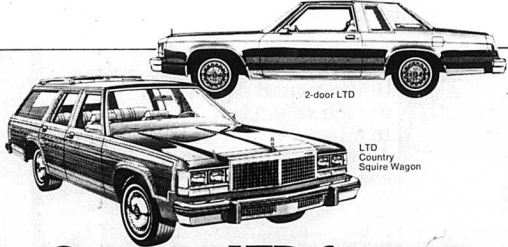

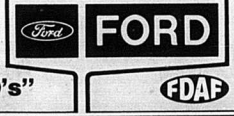

Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Persons should check with the center at least one day in advance to arrange a pickup.

— for doctor's appointments, health department visits and other services that can be done only on certain days, persons should call one day in advance or as early in the day as possible. Appointments should be made before 3 p.m.

— persons in the county should call as early as possible but before 9 a.m. on the appointed day.

— bus hours will be from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Phone number for all services is 289-7172.
