Kay's Kitchen

ZUCCHINI CASEROLE
3 medium zucchini, peeled and drained in small amount of salt water. Cook well. Add 1/2 ounce pkg cream cheese and three beaten eggs. Turn into buttered casserole and top with 2 cups crushed butter crackers. Bake 30 degrees for 20 minutes.

This is good if you combine the crumbs and by cup or more of melted butter, combining well and stir about half of them into the casserole and use the other half for the topping.

SUMMER SQUASH

5 to 8 medium squash
1 small onion, chopped
1 tablespoon sugar
2 tablespoons oil
1 can mushroom soup
1 cup sharp cheese, grated
by cup or more cracker crumbs
Cook squash, onion and sugar in small amount of water until tender. Combine butter, eggs and soup. Add drained squash and pour into greased baking dish. Bake 300 degrees about 15 to 20 minutes. Top with cheese and buttered crumbs and return to oven and brown lightly.

ZUCCHINI BOATS

6 or 8 small to medium zucchini
3 slices of bacon
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/4 cup heavy cream
1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese, (Velveeta is alright)
Dash of nutmeg
Salt and pepper to taste
1/4 cup bread crumbs
Cook bacon until crisp, drain, crumble and set aside. Wash and stem

ZUCCHINI SQUARES

1 cup sugar
1 1/2 cups flour
1/2 cup soda
1/2 cup oil
1/2 cup cinnamon
1/2 cup baking powder
1/2 cup chopped pecans
1 cup grated zucchini, drained
1/2 cup frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed
4 tablespoons cooking oil
1 1/2 teaspoons grated orange peel
Combine sugar, flour, baking powder, soda, salt, cinnamon, stir in nuts and zucchini. Beat egg whites lightly; add orange juice, and cooking oil. Fold into dry ingredients. Add orange peel; spoon into greased and floured 13 X 8 inch baking pan. Bake 350 degrees, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.
Cool and frost with powdered sugar, or butter frosting. Cut into squares.

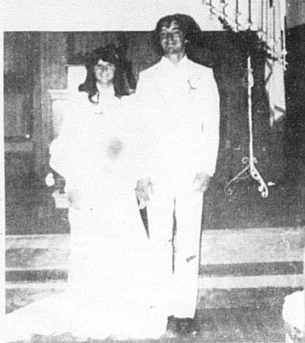
Students will begin arriving for the fall semester at Morehead State University on Sunday, Aug. 19, when residence halls open at 9 a.m.

Miss Paula Foster marries Mr. McNabb

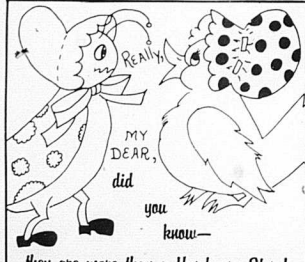
