Kay's Kitchen

June: To me its strawberry month. Bright, red, beautiful and delicious. You may choose from big, plump commercial variety, home grown, or wild strawberries.

For those who know where the wild strawberries grow find them sweet and delicious when ripe. Even though they are not as easy to pick as the cultivated ones, there is something special about picking these open plentiful, but now its hard to find delicious little berries.

Last summer I was lucky enough to have a friend give me a jar of wild strawberry jam.

Wild strawberries became an all year crop, the season was often announced by strawberry season, the typical full-rising event for churches and other neighborhood groups.

When buying strawberries look for bright red solid berries and use them as soon as possible since they are the most fragile fruit in flavor and texture.

Some of everyone has her own special short-cake recipe. I have given mine several times in this column so want to share again unless requested. It is of course an English shortbread or Scottish Bread. A far cry from sweet sponge cake usually used to do have a different recipe I would like to give. It is a bit different. You might like it, it is different.

STRAWBERRY CITRUS SHORTCAKE

2 cups strawberries
2 cups sugar
1 1/2 tablespoons sugar
1 egg white
1/2 cup orange juice
1/2 cup water
1/2 cup whipping cream, whipped and sweetened
Wash and stem strawberries. Slice into half; sprinkle with sugar and water, and mix thoroughly. In bowl, blend sugar and water. With fork, stir in orange juice and make soft dough. Turn onto floured board; knead gently 1 minute. Pat out to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut with floured 2 1/2-inch cutter.

Place on baking sheet. Brush with beaten egg. Bake in preheated 425-degree oven 8 to 10 minutes, or until golden.

For each serving, spoon berries and wild onto split biscuit. Cover with cream. Makes 6 servings.

Here is an old fashioned recipe called **BEHRY BUTTER**. Made with strawberries it is like a Strawberry Hard Sauce and delicious served on hot waffles, toast or plain cake. There is no end to the desserts you can use it on.

BEHRY BUTTER

4 tablespoons l. butter
1 cup powder l. sugar
1/2 cup rubbed berries
Cream butter with a spoon and add powdered sugar gradually until smooth. Cream. Makes 6 servings.

Refrigerate until serving time. Strawberries or raspberries make a delicious butter, as do crushed peaches. You may want to add a few cups berries, you must be the judge as to how fruity you want the butter.

Here is a new Chiffon Berry Pie that is delicious.

STRAWBERRY CHIFFON PIE

1 pint fresh strawberries
1 cup sugar
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup water
1 tablespoon lemon juice
2 egg whites
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup whipping cream, whipped
1 1/2-inch pastry shell, cooled
Crush strawberries and add 1/2 cup sugar; let stand 30 minutes. Sift gelatin in water; dissolve over low heat. Add strawberries, lemon juice, and dash of salt. Chill, stirring occasionally. Beat egg whites to soft peaks; gradually add 1/2 cup sugar, beating until stiff peaks form. Fold in strawberry mixture; then whipped cream. Chill until mixture mounds; then pile into pie shell. Chill until firm, about 4 hours. Garnish with additional whipped cream.

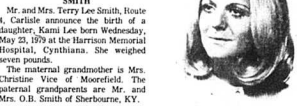
Births
