Now is good time for conservation

It is getting that time of year that many of our conservation practices can now be put on the land. It is wise to let the spring rains pass before starting some of the conservation practices which require too much water washes the seed away.
 Diversion channels above bottom land that has eroded on it often or continuously is an excellent conservation practice to prevent erosion on the crop land.
 Grassed waterways is another practice to let the water from the natural drainage draw to the creeks. It also prevents gullies and erosion. These grassed waterways can be used for pasture or hay.
 Building farm ponds at this time of the year is a sure way of having livestock water another year. The soil is dry enough, but not too wet to get good cooperation.
 Another source of good livestock water and farm water is spring developments. If you think you have a suitable site for a spring development, the Soil Conservation Service will come and check for the possibility of development.
 All the services of the Soil Conservation Service are free.
 Your local Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service Office will help you share on these conservation practices when they have money, if you want to sign up for sixty percent cost share. They also cost share on many other practices such as pasture and hayland seeding, pasture and hayland renovation.
 Virgil Sanders of the Hodge Crest Farm is building a grassed waterway. Paul Hedron on the Hicks Hardy Road is building two grassed waterways. Dr. Allen Hamon is developing a spring that would furnish water for 300 head of livestock. Gale Brady has finished two farm ponds. Ned Homer Tolson has set two bottom in tobacco this year that he built diversion channels above this spring.




Barkleys
 The last time Alben Barkley was on the ballot in Nicholas County prior to last Tuesday's primary was in 1941 when the elder Barkley won the August primary in Nicholas with 402 votes and carried the county in November 1,127 to 1,025 over his Republican opponent, James Parks. Last Tuesday Alben Barkley III, shown here at right with his grandfather, carried Nicholas in his successful bid for the Democratic nomination for Commissioner of Agriculture, Barkeley with 236 votes. MCC sets registration
 Registration for the 1979 Summer session at Maryville Community College will be held June 13 from 9-11 a.m. from 1:30-4 p.m. and again from 6-8 p.m. Classwork will begin the next day on June 14.
 This summer eighteen courses will be offered in addition to the five areas of co-op work experience which supervises student's work in the community. Developmental courses in reading, writing, and mathematics, Economics, Freshman English, Tennis, History, Psychology, Sociology, Basic Public Speaking, and four different courses in Mathematics make up the schedule. Some of the courses are offered in the evening hours with others being offered during the daytime.
 Those wishing to enroll in the Summer session may obtain complete summer schedules by calling or stopping by Maryville Community College any day. Students may register for one course or for as many as nine semester hours if they are in good standing. Resident tuition for full-time students is \$102 for 6-9 credit hours. Part-time student fees are \$17 per credit hour. Courses for which there is insufficient enrollment will be cancelled at the time of registration.
