

# Early Virginia town found

The earliest evidence of life and death in Colonial Virginia was unearthed at the site of a 360-year-old settlement.

A male skeleton found in a hastily dug grave at Wooten's Town, a wide-gabled colonial Williamsburg, was probably the victim of a widespread Indian massacre in Tidewater Virginia.

### Buffalo Trail gets grant

Rep. Carl D. Perkins has announced a grant and loan totaling \$1.1 million for the 200-acre Buffalo Trail Water Association Inc.

The money will be used to construct a new transmission line from the Western Fleming Water District treatment plant in Nicholas County to the existing Buffalo Trail Water Association.

The new source of water is expected to provide a dependable supply to the 300-user system. A condemnation fee of part of the cost of the treatment facility will be paid to the supplier.

Rep. Perkins said, "The improvements this money will make possible will go a long way to help alleviate certain problems of providing workable and reliable utility services needed by citizens in rural areas."

The money is from the Farmers Home Administration in the form of a \$726,000 grant and a \$384,000 loan.

### Unemployment decreases

Statistics released by the Department for Human Resources indicate unemployed Kentuckians numbered 70,000 in April, down 12, 700 from the 82,700 without jobs in March.

The state's preliminary April unemployment rate was 4.7 percent, 0.8 percentage points below the 5.5 percent rate in March.

The current decrease in state unemployment was due primarily to the increased hiring in the manufacturing, construction, trade and service industries.

Compared with April of last year, employment has dropped 1,200 persons, and the rate has remained the same.
