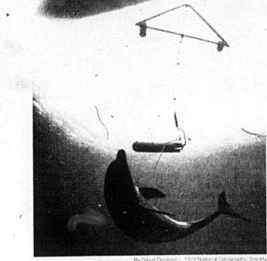

How to get your picture in the paper

Want to know how you can get more news and pictures of your club or organization's activities in the Mercury? It's simple, just appoint a club photographer.

With the coming of age of instant cameras and fully automatic cameras photography has been taken from the confusing maze of f-stops and shutter speeds to a relatively simple aim-and-shoot process that enables anyone to take a good picture. And good pictures that come into the Mercury office usually always find their way into the paper.

There are so many more people interested in photography now as compared to 10 years ago that no club should have any trouble finding someone who will qualify as club photographer. Not only are those pictures of club meetings, activities, special functions and dinners prime material for a club scrapbook but they can also show the community what your club does.

If the Mercury photographers cover every event for which a request was made they would spend all their time going from meeting to meeting. That's not bad, but there are many other events and activities that must be covered and eventually a gap arises that can best be filled by a club photographer.

And the interest is there. Anyone who attended the Nicholas County Elementary School kindergarten graduation recently knew just how many parents have cameras and aren't afraid to use them.

Some local clubs, like the Jaycees, have a club photographer. Others have members who bring their cameras along from time to time to the club's meetings and functions. From there it is a simple step to appointing a club photographer and letting one person be in charge of recording with camera the club's activities.

There are a few simple rules to remember in taking a picture that you wish to have printed in the Mercury. First, the picture should preferably be black-and-white. Color is acceptable but the contrast range (the difference in tones between the dark and light colors in the picture) are more critical. A dark color photo won't reproduce very well on newspaper. For that reason

if you use color film, take two or three shots at different settings to get a full range of contrast.

Secondly, the picture should be clear. Most non-adjustable cameras have zones in which the subject to be photographed is always in focus. Be sure to pay careful attention to this focusing zone. Blurry pictures might reproduce well as far as the contrast range but the picture is too blurry, the people won't be recognizable.

Third, practice good composition. The most common failure of amateur photographers, aside from incorrect exposure, is composition (or the way the people to be photographed are arranged) that cuts the subject's heads off or pushes them to one side of the picture.

That's about it. Remember, if you are in a club or group that meets several times a year and has several different functions you should explore the possibility of a club photographer. The newspaper photographers are usually on a strict schedule and cannot always wait around to set up a shot unless it is arranged ahead of time. The Mercury photographers really can't act as professional photographers because neither their equipment nor their objective is aimed that way.

On the other hand, a professional photographer charges what some people feel are exorbitant prices until you begin to figure his time, equipment and expenses of producing the picture. A good middle ground is the club photographer. With a simple camera he or she can supply the club with all the pictures necessary for publicity or scrapbook purposes, as well as be a source of requests for members who need them. And the cost compared to a professional is minimal.
