Board to accept bids

The Nicholas County Board of Education will receive bids at the July meeting for supplies for the coming school year. Items to be awarded include school insurance, gasoline, milk, bread, tires and antifreeze. The bids will be opened and awarded on July 7, the next regular board meeting. The board also awarded a seven percent increase in local certified personnel. Classified personnel includes all employees not classified to teach. Named as cheerleader sponsors for the coming year were Katie Hunt, variety and Marcelle Shidmore, junior variety. Purchase of furniture for the high school in the amount of \$2,850 was approved by the board. Expanded its errors and omissions type insurance coverage to include all school employees. Applied for an innovative nutrition education project. The project, if approved, will be conducted with the state Department of Education and the WPKO health district.
