Directors of Carlisle Cemetery

To try and keep the Cemetery as most people want it kept, it is our goal to bring to your attention the By-Laws of the Cemetery, and to up-date said by-laws. To implement these changes we need the **understanding** of all available Deed Holders. Check with the Superintendent or one of the Directors concerning original by-laws of charter dated Feb. 14, 1861.

Below are listed some of the by-laws of many years ago.

1. No shrubbery or trees planted without authorization of Board.
2. No minors in cemetery without parents.
3. Not responsible for accidents.
4. Before buying monuments check for size of lot due to locations.
5. *Artificial flowers allowed on grave 2 weeks after Memorial Day.
6. No fencing allowed on lots (interfers with mowing).

(Please remove coat hangers, etc. from graves when removing decorations to make for easier mowing and avoid costly accidents which Cemetery will have to pay.)
*Artificial flowers attached to top of monument allowed anytime.

Effective June 28, 1979 All Sales and Opening of Graves Will Be Handled By Cemetery Superintendent and Billed Accordingly.

The complaints we are hearing quite frequently refer to the **infringement** of shrubbery and trees from adjacent lot owners to the extent that these items are **obscuring the property of others.**

Many trees and shrubs thru the years have gotten completely out of hand. We ask that you trim the shrubs, etc. on **your property** and to make this known to those who might be responsible for the property of others, who long since have no one to attend to their lots.

All of us are very much aware of these and other problems which confront the cemetery daily. Work with us, and we will work with you, as we endeavor to make our final resting place a place of beauty.

Watch changes as you visit the Cemetery this summer. Tell your friends. Together we can do it...divided we cannot.
