## Harrison tops Jackets; cheerleaders take second

A 96-69 win over Nicholas County by eventual district victors Harrison County shattered any hopes for the Bluejackets to advance in region play.  
The game, however, was hard fought by the Jacket team and the Harrison Thunder led by only 11 at the end of the first quarter, 29-11.  
Harrison widened their lead in the second quarter by adding 22 points while Nicholas could only score 16, marking the score 47-27 at the half.  
Although Nicholas struggled to catch up with the regional favorite Harrison, they failed as the third quarter ended with Harrison still leading, 65-34.  
Time wasn't enough for the Jackets as the Breeds kept going to end the game 96-69.  
Mike Hutton was Bluejacket high point man with 26. Mark Baddell followed with 18. David McCaffrey had eight. Mark Vice had four. Dan Markland had two and James Anderson and Mike Sewell had one each.  
Girls came close.  
The Nicholas County Lady Jackets were expected to be slaughtered by the Bluejackets in the first quarter, making their District playoff Monday, Feb. 26 at the Coliseum gym.  
That "slaughter" turned out to be a slim five-point victory for the Lady Colons, 38-34. The victory advanced them to the district finals.

**Maxey Flats plan due this Friday**  
Secretary Eugene Moore, Department for Natural Resources and Environmental Protection, will present plans for the future management of the Maxey Flats nuclear waste dump, due to the Special Advisory Committee on Nuclear Waste Disposal, at 1 p.m. Friday, March 9, in Room 327 of the State Capitol.  
The plans for the Fleming County site, have been developed by the Department for Natural Resources and Environmental Protection, as the management of Maxey Flats has just been transferred to them from the Department of Finance.  
The report from Moore will also include a report on the renewal of the contract with the Nuclear Engineering Company (NECO). NECO contract will be up for renewal at the end of March.  
The committee will also hear testimony from the U. S. Geological Survey and from consulting firm Dames and Moore with progress reports on site studies being conducted at the nuclear waste site.
