Before I get started on anything else, I want to give two recipes that were requested almost a year ago. Had I looked for a recipe and could not find one, so began asking anyone I thought would know about them. The first would have been a pleasure presented to me with two recipes for Jam Pie. Needless to say I was more than pleased. Here they are.

JAM PIE
 1 cup cream
 1 cup jam, your choice
 1 cup butter
 4 egg yolks
 Flour to thicken
 Vanilla, to your taste

Combine all ingredients and beat until thickened. Pour into baked pie crust.

To the egg whites add 8 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar. Whip meringue until stiff and glossy. Divide equally for the two pies. You may divide the egg whites, two to each bowl, then divide other ingredients in half if you wish. This may make it easier to top each pie more evenly. Be sure to spread meringue to crust to seal. Bake in a 350 degree oven until golden.

JAM PIE
 Beat 3 egg yolks thoroughly, add one cup sour cream, one cup of jam and one tablespoon of flour. Boil these together
