

ASC signups on

Sign-up for the Feed Grain and Wheat Program is now underway. Farmers have until April 30 to visit the local ASCS office and sign-up for program benefits. Under the program feed grain farmers are asked to set aside 10 percent of their 1979 acreage, and 20 percent of their wheat acreage, and through participation in the program, farmers will be eligible for cost deficiency payments, and disaster payments.

The 1979 Agricultural Conservation Program for Nicholas County is almost the same as last year's program. To be eligible for cost-share assistance for practices, farmers must make application at the ASCS office. Applicants must wait for notice of practice approval before starting the practice.

This year the maximum cost-share limit has been increased to \$1,500 as opposed to the \$1,250 limit in the 1978 program. Anyone wishing to do a seeding practice should apply to the county agents' office in the basement of the courthouse.

1979 barley quota notices will be mailed today, March 15. Notices for the 1979 crop can be made at the ASCS office starting tomorrow, March 16. At the current time, the barley tobacco provision are the same as last year. All producers will be notified if there are any changes in the program.

Bull shopping more than price

Shopping for a bull involves more science than art, if you want a bull that will improve the performance of your cow-calf herd.

Before you go out to buy a bull, analyze your herd to see what traits you need to make the improvement you want, and then base your selection on performance records, advise Russell Bretahl, Extension beef cattle specialist at the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.

"Performance records don't make a bull any better," says Bretahl, "but records give you an objective method of comparing bulls raised in the same group, the more valuable the records are in making your selection."

"If your major goal is selling more pounds of calf, place most of your selection emphasis on the bull's 365-day adjusted weight," advises Bretahl.

explaining that selection for this trait affects weight at weaning as well as at a year of age.

Bulls with superior performance are available from breeders who participate in Kentucky's on-farm testing program and/or enter bulls in the central test program.

Two spring sales of performance tested bulls are scheduled. The first is March 15 at the University of Kentucky's station near Princeton, Kentucky, 13 Angus and 63 Polled Hereford bulls from the state's on-farm performance testing program. The second sale will be held at the Paris Stockyards, offering bulls from the Kentucky Central Bull Test Station.

The sale in Paris will include 15 Angus, 9 Charolais, 1 Chianina, 1 Limousin, 19 Polled Hereford, 1 Red Angus, 2 Shorthorn and 3 Simmental. The bulls will average about 13 months of age on the day of the sale.

Medical grants fund seeks applicants

The Rural Kentucky Medical Scholarship Fund is now accepting applications from medical students who are residents of Kentucky and have been admitted to one of the two medical schools in the state, according to G. L. Simpson, M.D., Chairman of the Fund's Board of Trustees.

The Fund was created in 1946 as a means of providing a better distribution of physicians in the rural areas of Kentucky and now has 210 physicians in practice in 86 counties with 36,000 patients in designated rural counties. Since its beginning, the Fund has loaned over 1-1/2 million dollars.

Freshman students may borrow up to \$4,000 provided they will agree to practice in any of over 100 rural counties of the Commonwealth.
