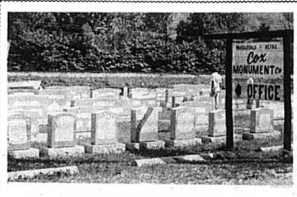

most of our employees make \$250 to \$450 a week. But still, everyone wants to do better — and we want our people to do better, too.

"That's why we've already offered maximum increase possible under President Carter's anti-inflation wage and price guidelines.

"So we're asking you, Censar, why the strike? We think you owe the American people and our employees some answers, now.

"Like why are we getting so many more complaints about the workers' medical plan since the UFW took over? And why, in the meantime, have you amassed a \$6.2 million surplus in the medical fund?

"Why are our workers forced to turn over one day's pay each year? What do you do with the money? — money our workers need — money we are paying to them!

"And what, we would all like to know, is the union's so-called 'Martin Luther King Fund'? What is the money we pay into it used for? Does even one penny go to our workers?

These issues and questions are of concern to the American public. Farmers, like other Americans, must pay more for fuel, energy, and other necessities. But consumers should not have to pay for the buildup of the political war chest of a farm workers union.

Moreover, a union should not be permitted to choke off supplies of food. The strikes in New Orleans and California underscore the need for placing unions under the antitrust law, as U. S. Rep. Philip M. Crane urged in legislation introduced in the 94th Congress. Unions today represent the last monopoly with power to threaten entire cities and industries.

Certainly, the nation can't afford union domination of police services or farm production.

necessary to pay for tax cuts passed in the session.

It was during that same session that the General Assembly gave itself additional power over state spending by strengthening its control over the Capital Construction Fund.

After a thorough study of the fund, the legislature said future spending from the fund would have to be approved by the legislature, and the management of the fund would be monitored by a legislative committee.
