Every party needs something sweet, and Derby parties are no exception. Since I seem to be trying to make the entertaining as easy as possible, the sweets will be "finger food" too. Treats are always good. And with the purchase of tart shells you may save a variety of these with very little work.

CHERRY TARTS
1/4 cup melted butter
1 1/4 cups sugar
1 1/4 teaspoons cornstarch
1 1/2 teaspoons vinegar
3 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla
Baked tart shells

COCONUT TARTS
1 1/2 cups sugar
1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted
4 teaspoons lemon juice
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cups flaked coconut
10 unbaked tart shells

juice, vanilla, stir in coconut. Pour into unbaked tart shells. Bake in 350 degree oven for 40 minutes or until knife inserted in middle, just off center, comes out clean. Cool. —Carolyn Allen comes out.

CHOCOLATE TARTS
2 egg yolks
1 teaspoon sugar
6 ounces semi-sweet chocolate chips
1 teaspoon instant coffee
1/4 cup scalded milk
1/4 cup finely chopped pecans

Place all ingredients except milk in blender. Blend one minute at high speed. Pour into bowl and chill. Before filling, brush with milk. Add remaining ingredients. Spoon into tart shells. Serve with grated chocolate or coconut on top. Use extra small shells for these dainties.

Stonehammer's namesake speaks his mind at 100

(Editor's note: This article about a former Nicholas County resident was reprinted from The Cincinnati Enquirer.)

Thomas Metcalfe raised lots of tobacco, but he never used it. He says women are a "nuisance." And he thinks the government's good to sell.

At 100, he's earned the right to say it. He's been around long enough to have formed some pretty valid opinions. And since most of his comments are and one kicked out of office," and he thinks the government is in ruins.

"They got too soft. They pay for Medicare and all those things. They can't do that or they will eventually break the government," he said.

"Same thing as the way England went broke," he says. "And we're following them right down the line."

A hard-working farmer, Metcalfe descends from a tough breed of man. His ancestor, Thomas Metcalfe, (1780-1865), who earned his nickname as a stonehammer. The governor built Forest Retreat Farm, his home in Nicholas County, (now owned by Dr. Edlie Aubrey of Cincinnati) as well as courthouses in both Ohio and the commonwealth.

Metcalfe's Uncle Lem, Metcalfe said he once ran a big farm "up near Mayville" — had 13 men.

"During August you don't have much to do on the farm," he said. "Crops are laid by — and we'd take a big wagon and four horses and haul 150 bushels of wheat or corn to Mayville. Then we'd bring back 150 bushels of coal."

"We'd come in and set supper and then go out and unload the coal and take the wagon to the barn and load it to be ready to work again in the morning. And the men never said a word" (They were probably too tired.)

"After retiring from farming in Kentucky and near Morrow, Ohio, the Metcalfes moved to Cincinnati. He has lived independently and alone on Dale Road on the edge of Norwood until about three years his wife died at 80. When he retired he worked as a

crossing guard for Norwood school children from ages 6-8.

Now he's with his son and daughter-in-law Mr. and Mrs. Charles (Duke) Metcalfe, at 1804 Franklin St., Bond Hill. Duke is secretary for the Bond Hill

Metcalfe spends his afternoons listening to Radio games and thinks it's pretty smart his 100th birthday falls on Opening Day.

Metcalfe doesn't abide by today's easy life. "We didn't have to die," he says. "You folks got out and worked in the open air. People worked from sunup to sundown, for 50 cents a day. He scuffed at the eight-hour day."

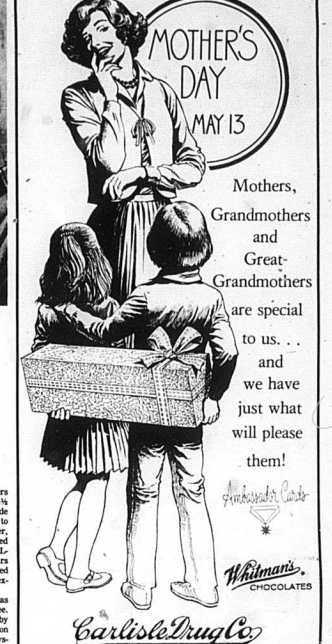
