### Road damage \$23.2 million

The State Transportation Department reports it will cost an estimated \$23.3 million, or about \$1,000 a mile, to repair state-maintained roads damaged during the winter of 1979. Transportation Secretary C. A. I. Grayson said the maintenance staff in the bureau of highways began surveying the 20,000-mile state-maintained highway system in early March.

In addition, local officials have reported winter damage estimates totaling \$21 million on county roads and \$2.2 million on city streets. Grayson said some of the winter damage on the state-maintained system will be corrected by resurfacing programs for 1979. "For the first time we are taking bids earlier on resurfacing projects, so the work can be completed this year," he said.

The state maintenance budget for this year includes about \$20 million for resurfacing on 60 miles of highways, most of which is already under contract. Additional resurfacing costing more than \$10 million will be done under the state's energy road fund and rural secondary road program for 1979-80.

Repairs by state maintenance crews will be financed with existing funds as much as possible, Grayson said, and the damage estimates will be considered as next year's maintenance programs are developed. "Most of the repair work involves filling potholes and patching rough areas in road surfaces," he said.

A. R. Romine, assistant state highway engineer for operations, said maintenance crews are working overtime to expedite surface repairs. The crews are currently fixing the most severe damage, which has the highest priority, Romine noted that "hot mix" material is now available and will be used for more permanent repairs in the next few months.

**Change returns?**  
 If you need to change something on your federal income tax return after you've filed, you can make the correction on Form 1042X, according to the Internal Revenue Service.

The IRS said that generally the Form 1042X may be used to amend your tax return any time during the three years following the due date (including extension) of the original return. The form is available from IRS offices.
