Spring development can help save water

Usually a pump house is not required with a spring development. Usually the pump can be installed over the water supply and the water will keep the pump warm enough to prevent freezing.

J. W. Roberts near Barterville on the Saltwell Road developed a spring that required a pump. This spring will furnish water for all the livestock on the farm. Dr. Allen J. Hamon is going to develop a spring that will furnish water for a good part of his farm.

The Soil Conservation Service gives free help on spring developments and all other conservation practices.

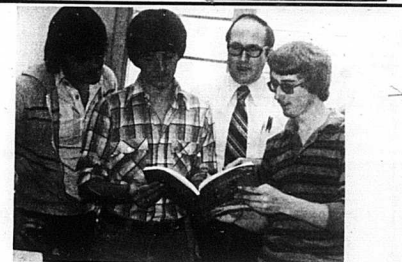
